The regular meeting of the Library Trustees was held on October 14th. Present Messrs. F.L. Chapin, F.E. Corbin, J.E. Paige, George Grant. George Grant elected Secretary pro tem.

Voted- That list of periodicals be accepted as submitted by the Librarian, excepting "The new Republic", that regards the latter, the Secretary pro tem and Librarian confer.

Mr. Grant was chosen to draw up resolutions on the death of J.M. Cochran.

Resolutions

In the death of John M. Cochran, the Board of Trustees of the Jacob Edwards Library, of which he was a member, feel that they have lost one of their number who was most helpful at all times in directing the affairs of the Library. He brought to the deliberations of the Board an open, well

informed mind, and had an abiding desire to advance and strengthen the work and purposes for which the Library was founded.

Of his time and thought he gave freely, and without other compensation than that of the satisfaction derived from action well done, or advice conscientiously offered, such action and such advice being always accepted with courtesy and accorded due consideration.

He performed every duty of his trusteeship with the same care and promptness that marked his character in whatever he undertook to do, and his willingness to bear his share of the work and responsibility devolving upon him, was fully appreciated by every member of the Board.
