for approval at the regular monthly meetings.

Moved that following rules be adopted:

Rules of the Library

Anyone who is over eighteen years of age and has lived in Southbridge more than six months may take books by signing the application blank of the Library.

Anyone who has lived in Southbridge less than six months must, in addition to the above, be "vouched for" by the signature of a resident of Southbridge.

(whose name appears on the poll tax list). Or, he may take books by depositing at the library two dollars, which will be returned whenever he returns all books and asks for his deposit.

Children under eighteen must have the signature of one parent on the application blank.

Borrowers may take any number of books on a card, the only restriction being that only one "one-week book" and one "one week magazine" may be taken.

Any child from out of town who attends Southbridge public schools or high-school, may take books from the library free of charge, but may take not more than one book of fiction and one of non-fiction at a time and no "one-week" books or magazines.

Anyone else living in adjoining towns, may take books from the library by paying at the rate of twenty-five cents for three months but may take not more than one book of fiction and one book of non-

fiction at one time and no "one-week" books or magazines.

No charge is made for borrowers' cards unless the card is lost, in which case the lost card may be replaced for five cents, or by waiting for a card one week after notifying the library.
