January 7, 1926

Present Messrs. Paige, Corbin, Armstrong and Grant.

Voted- To ask the town for an appropriation of \$10,000 for 1926.

Voted- To subscribe to the "Fiftieth anniversary publications of the A.L.A.

Voted- To buy the list of new books presented.

March 5, 1926

Present Messrs. Corbin, Paige, Armstrong and Grant.

Voted- To accept the list of books presented.

Voted- To acknowledge the receipt of books from

Mr. Felix Gatineau.

Voted- To grant the Librarian a three months leave of absence from the library, in addition to her regular vacation.

April 9, 1926

Present Messrs. Paige, Armstrong, Corbin and Grant.

Mr. Paige elected chairman.

Mr. Grant elected secretary.

Book committee: Messrs. Corbin, Paige and Grant.

Building committee: Messrs. Paige, Chapin and Armstrong.

Voted: That the building committee be instructed to make necessary repairs on the building as they may deem essential.

Voted: To accept the Indian relics offered to the Library by W.R. Parquhar.

October 7, 1926

Present Messrs. Paige, Armstrong, and Corbin.

Voted- To order for 1927 the same periodicals and newspapers now subscribed to.

Voted- To purchase the list of books presented.

Voted- To open the Library on Sunday afternoon from two to five (if we can find a good man to leave in charge), from November through April.

November 4, 1926

Present Messrs. Paige, Corbin and Armstrong.

Sunday opening discussed. Decided that children under high school age should not be admitted, unless accompanied by an adult. Decided that the reference room should be open. Decided to take four Sunday newspapers; N.Y. Times, N.Y. Herald, Boston Herald, Boston Post.

Decided that the "Historical room" may be used by small reading clubs.

January 13, 1927

Present Messrs. Paige, Corbin and Grant.

Annual report of Librarian read, accepted and ordered printed, in the annual report of the town.

Attendance of about thirty reported for last Sunday.

Voted to ask \$ 8,000 appropriation.

Increase of salary for Miss Miersch and for Miss

Murphy discussed, but in the absence of a quorum, no action was taken further than deciding to bring it before the next meeting.

Voted- To approve a list of books submitted by the Librarian.

Voted- To authorize the purchase of a children's catalogue case.
