

Report presented to the Board of Trustees by Margaret Morrissey, Director presented February 25, 2025

Budget

• Presented the budget request to the finance team on February 5th. Requested the Technical/Circulation Assistant position be reclassified from S-5 to S-7, as it has bookkeeping, records management, benefits, AP as the core tasks and needs to be in line with similar positions at Town Hall.

Building

- Service call to the elevator company as the doors were staying open 12/2. Repaired. The elevator has passed inspection 1/16.
- There is a new company providing the preventative maintenance on the HVAC SS Service Corp and the winterizing was completed on 11/19. The tech accidentally put his foot through a small section of the ceiling in the 1966 attic.
- DPW has repaired the ceiling/floor in the 1966 attic. The area in the attic now needs to be marked off to direct people to the joists and a platform built around the AHU in the attic to make it more secure and accessible.
- HVAC preventative maintenance will now be done on a quarterly basis. Centralized contract.
- Custodian has completed the stripping of the vinyl flooring and recoating, on the lower level.
- Ricoh service call 12/27 to clean the printer/copier/scanner. We do not have a contract for the other desk top stand alone machines. We were advised it is \$230 for a service call.
- LockOut Locksmith will install the new Sargent locks on the north entrance doors.
- Bay Path Vocational Electrical Students and Instructors were here 2/24 to do various electrical
 work and tracing some cables from our Switch. The library will only have to pay for materials
 used on the project. They are initially going to focus on the cabling in the building to trace the
 cables back to the switch and relabel. They are organizing that 3D covers for the floor sockets be
 printed. A map of the ports and switches will be produced for us to have, as well.

Chess Park

The group met 2/23 in the Pioppi Room. Project is moving forward. Bid documents are being
prepared by Joe Coan, Landscape Architect. Joe is now working for The Engineering Corporation
(TEC) https://theengineeringcorp.com/ and the library's project is posted on their site.

Digital Commonwealth - Boston Public Library

Ryan, the Business Manager Stonebridge Press has signed the agreement to allow all issues of the Southbridge Evening News to be digitized. I have provided a copy of the agreement to the digitization staff at Boston Public Library. BPL will procure the masters from NE Micrographics and digitize the complete run of the paper. A follow up email has been sent to ascertain the status of the project.
