

# Report presented to the Board of Trustees by Margaret Morrissey, Director presented March 25, 2025

## Budget

• Presented the budget request to the finance team on February 5<sup>th</sup>. Requested the Technical/Circulation Assistant position be reclassified from S-5 to S-7, as it has bookkeeping, records management, benefits, AP as the core tasks and needs to be in line with similar positions at Town Hall. Waiting for a response to the budget review by the finance team as to what the budget request to the Town Council will be.

### Building

- HVAC preventative maintenance will now be done on a quarterly basis. Centralized contract.
- Guardian Energy here to review the 1914 attic for the automatic louvre project 3/4.
- DiMauro Carpet has installed new floor covering from the top of the first staircase to the Main Street entrance. Completed 3/5
- P and P Contractors reviewed repairs to north entrance doors and repainting. Quote \$3,600, 3/5.
- Requested quote for the restoration and insulation of the windows in the 1914 and 1966 sections of the building. P and P Contractors have conducted a site visit.

- DPW (2 crew members) were here to build a catwalk in the 1966 attic 3/7
- During the semi-annual fire inspection, a deficit was identified with the horns on the second floor. The issue resolution is a power pack. Quote requested. Separately an alarm notification for lower hallway, 3/10. No report.

- LockOut Locksmith completed the installation of the new bronze Sargent locks on the north entrance doors 3/24.

  pay for materials used on the project. They are initially going to focus on the cabling in
  the building to trace the cables back to the switch and relabel. They are organizing that

## Digital Commonwealth – Boston Public Library

 Boston Public Library will undertake to digitize the pre1928 newspapers and work with New England Micrographics to obtain the master. Ryan, the Business Manager Stonebridge Press has signed the agreement to allow all issues of the Southbridge Evening News to be digitized. I have provided a copy of the agreement to the digitization staff at Boston Public Library. BPL will procure the masters from NE Micrographics and digitize the complete run of the paper. A follow up email has been sent to ascertain the status of the project.
