Building

- Annual state elevator inspection on October 11, 2024 – a 90 day certificate was issued as there was an issue with the Stop Switch (installed in early 2022). The repair work was completed on 11/14. The elevator is ready for reinspection and Elevator Maintenance Service will submit the application.
- There is a new company providing the preventative maintenance on the HVAC – SS Service Corp and the winterizing was completed on 11/19. The tech accidentally put his foot through a small section of the ceiling in the 1966 attic.
- DPW have begun to repair the ceiling/floor in the 1966 attic.
- Custodian has completed the shampooing of the carpeting throughout the building. Next task is the vinyl flooring to be stripped and resurfaced.

Chess Park

- The group met 11/21 in the Pioppi Room. Project is moving forward. Bid documents are being prepared by Joe Coan, Landscape Architect and will be ready by mid December.

Digital Commonwealth – Boston Public Library

- Boston Public Library will undertake to digitize the pre1928 newspapers and work with New England Micrographics to obtain the master. Ryan, the Business Manager Stonebridge Press has signed the agreement. I have provided a copy to the digitization staff at Boston Public Library. BPL will procure the masters from NE Micrographics and digitize the complete run of the paper.

FOJEL

- Group met on Monday, November 12th, in the Pioppi Room, at 2 pm.

- Friends have staffed a table at local markets and other outlets, and had the Craft Basket tickets available, as well as Friends Membership forms.

Fuel Assistance

- LIHEA – Fuel Assistance program offered by WCAC began in November and will run until April 2025. Southbridge clients can make an appointment to meet with the staff at JEL every second week.

Grants and Donations

- The grant application for \$200,000 to the MA Office of Disability in support of the modernization of the elevator was declined. Meeting requested with the Town Manager to discuss.
- Call for Public Art/Make It Public – the art grant award has been issued, for the pocket park at 76 Central Street.
- Local Cultural Council grants – worked with many presenters and submitted 2 on behalf of JEL

Local History

- Attended the MOTT (MA Office of Travel and Tourism) grant group meeting to compile a database of historic buildings, as part of a series of walking tours that are being planned.
- Digitized some materials locally and posted to the Reference Tab on the JEL website

Long Range Plan

- Staff continues to promote the databases and streaming services subscribed to by the library. Staff is also working on other promotional materials

Outreach

- Call for Public Art has been issued - part of the *MIP (Making It Public)* program and that Peg Dean and I are participating in. There is a \$15,000 grant available for public art in the community. Feedback has also been requested and received from the Redevelopment Authority.
- Attended the Local Historic District Study Committee presentation at Town Hall 11/20. Event was recorded by SCTV.
- The Regional Environmental Council (REC) who manage the Farmers Market Program and we are hoping to host the winter market for 6-8 weeks in February-March, in the lower hallway, as there would be mutual benefits to our patrons and the community at large.
- Adult Services Librarian attended Parents' Night at SMHS (11/12)
- JEL hosted the Digital Equity presentation 11/18 (which was attended by a representative from MBI – MA Broadband Institute) and I attended and presented some information on behalf of the community. The Town of Southbridge is working with consultants Kimley-Horn on this project.

 - Patrons have figured out a work-around on the 24-hr. borrowing pause by having other friends check the devices out for them, creating an unfair and inequitable situation, denying others access.
 - Patron are not returning the devices, in spite of the fact that the data service has already been shut off.
