

# Report presented to the Board of Trustees by Margaret Morrissey, Director presented September 24, 2024

## **ARIS**

 Annual Report Information Survey was submitted which is the statistical component of the State Aid Grant. Currently working on the financial report, due October 4<sup>th</sup>, 2024. Requesting \$45,000 for Books and Materials to supplement the operating budget line.

#### Building

- R& M Electric installed a new box to restore operation of the emergency lighting system 8/8.
- The contract for the elevator maintenance will be switching to one vendor-model for all the town departments. DPW conducted a walkthrough of all town buildings for prospective elevator maintenance on 8/15. During the month, the elevator had an issue with the door, same issue as noted 4/25/24
- National Grid has declined to offer the incentive program for the automatic louvre project in the 1914 attic. However, the motorized dampers project was accepted for funding (\$20,258) by the Green Communities Grant.
- DPW noticed there is a slate missing over 1914 section of the roof 7/30. Quannh Roofing replacing the slates 9/24.
- Requested meeting with DPW about the landscaping (the perimeter area in particular and other needs) and custodian duties.
- Contacted DiMauro Carpet regarding some fraying noticed in the stairs. Installer will be coming by to review.
- Annual state elevator inspection scheduled for October 11<sup>th</sup>.

## Unhoused patrons

- The area at the north entrance was being used by unhoused people to sleep under the awning. In two separate instances concerned patrons addressed this issue with the director, as access to the book return and electrical outlet was now considered uncomfortable. In consultation with the Town Manager and the Police Chief, the folks were spoken to and advised that town property was not an appropriate place to sleep. Those that refused to move were 'No Trespassed' by the Police Department.
- Earlier in the month, Open Sky had been contacted and they indicated they had contacted and
  offered assistance but the services had been refused. The agency provided some hygiene items
  and toys to distribute.
