ARIS (Annual Report Information Survey)

 The first part of the state aid report for the MA Board of Library Commissioners has been submitted.

Building

- Elevator not working after a power outage the previous evening (not during JEL service hours). It needed to be restarted and was operational again. The modernization of the elevator is still needed. The response on the MA Office of Disability grant application is not expected until October.
- Waiting for a response from Norel Services regarding the audibles on the second floor. They are still researching the issue. I reached George Aguilar 8/13 and he assured me that he would research the issue with his team and get back to me with a proposal.
- Requested quote for the restoration and insulation of the windows in the 1914 and 1966 sections of the building. P and P Contractors have conducted a site visit. Researching whether there is a de-leading certificate on file. Followed up and still waiting for a response.
- Guardian Energy Management installed two automatic dampers in the 1914 attic to ventilate the area 8/4. A tech returned 8/6 to review the work and a thermostat will be installed.
- Two of the four LED lights at the sculptures were vandalized. DPW repaired 8/7.
- The Salle Notre Dame stained glass transom given in memory of Paul R. Tremblay by the Tremblay Family was refurbished and installed by Gabriel McCarthy and team 8/10.
- Jim Wales Pest Control quarterly service 8/15
- Curbside sign installed by Globe Signs, on the wall, at the north entrance 8/28.

Chess Park

- Group met 8/21.
- Procedure in place. Cash and cheques can be processed by JEL staff

- In discussion with Mike Monahan, New England Microfilm to gauge the cost of obtaining master copies of the various Southbridge newspapers that we have received approval to digitize.

Digital Commonwealth – Boston Public Library

- Met with Jessica Colati, Preservation Specialist, MBLC to discuss the newspaper digitization and to ask for assistance to move the project forward 7/30. Have sent follow up email and waiting for a response.
- Still waiting for a response from Boston Public Library regarding the newspaper digitization project.
- o In a follow up call to Jake Sadow of the Boston Public Library (BPL) the schedule for digitizing the Southbridge News has been delayed into 2026. Given the state of the economy and changes happening with lightning speed, I have requested that BPL would harvest the copies that have already been digitized by the newspaper, for which we have been given unconditional access. Apparently, this is a new process and the staff will need to discuss and decide whether funding is available in the new fiscal year (July 1). Awaiting a response as one wants to show our appreciation of the generosity of the Stonebridge Press and Salmon Publishing to share the back issues of the newspaper.
